“Liquid Assets” documentary to be broadcast on PBS

Montana PBS will be broadcasting “Liquid Assets: The Story of Our Water Infrastructure,” a special documentary produced by Emmy award-winning Penn State University (PSU) Public Broadcasting about the challenges facing the nation’s rapidly aging drinking water, wastewater and storm water systems. The first airing in Montana is at 9 p.m., Tuesday, Jan. 20, following the presidential inauguration.

“We’re pleased that Montana’s PBS stations will be sharing this important message across the state,” notes Cary Hegreberg, Montana Contractors’ Association executive director. The MCA is a sponsor of the program in Montana, and the Association of General Contractors has contributed \$100,000 to PSU Public Broadcasting. Both organizations feel it is imperative that the public understand the critical state of the country’s water infrastructure.

“This program has the potential to prompt conversation across the state about our need to upgrade our water infrastructure, especially now with the possible economic stimulus package containing funding for such projects,” Hegreberg concluded.
